PUBLIC COMMENT:

Frank D'Amore, 40 Willow Avenue, North Plainfield, recalled his request at the last meeting that the Council use their investigative authority to determine why OPRA requests are not responded to within the statutory time frame. He explained that as of today, he had still not received a response to an OPRA request submitted on July 6, 2021. He reminded that Rental Certificates of Occupancy must be issued and strict enforcement of same is essential for the safety and well being of the residents.

Ms. Miller introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 10-12-21-04 BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of North Plainfield that prior to the adjournment of this meeting it shall convene in executive session from which the public will be excluded for the purpose of discussion on:

Affordable Housing/Land Acquisition/State Mandate

Exclusion of the public for this purpose is specifically permitted by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 10:4-6 et seq. The contents of this discussion will not be disclosed until such time as the disclosure of same will not adversely affect the public interest and upon resolution of the Council. Formal action may be taken following end of executive session.

Seconded by Ms. Corzo and on roll call carried all six voting aye. Executive Session convened at 7:56 p.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Motion to come out of Executive Session by Ms. Miller, seconded by Ms. Given and carried unanimously.

Council President Stabile reconvened the meeting at 9:22 p.m. with all six council members present.

Mr. Bernstein advised that all council members present at the convening of the regular meeting were still present, as well as the Mayor, Business Administrator, Director of Law, Mr. George, Borough Clerk and Deputy Borough Clerk. Discussion included an update relative to the Borough's on-going desire to seek compliance with their Affordable Housing obligation,

potential negotiations related to Union County parkland, and State legislation regarding electric vehicles. No formal action would be taken.

COMMENTS BY MAYOR, ADMINISTRATOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS

Mr. Hollod thanked the Council for their support of the Bond Ordinances.

Mayor La Ronde reminded that Somerset County residents will have the option to vote early at the Community Center from October 23 to October 31 with Sunday hours from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and all other days from 10 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Clean Community Day will be held Saturday, October 16 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. October is National Fire Prevention Month and the Fire Department will kick off their 2021 Change Your Clock Change Your Battery program.

Ms. Corzo thanked the library staff for their Hispanic Heritage Month Celebration: De Colores on Saturday, October 9 which included activities, stories, and crafts for kids. Ms. Given added that the library offers two grab-and-go packages available in their lobby.

Mr. Merrill reported that the Krausche Field renovations committee would hire one contractor to complete the project.

Motion to adjourn by Ms. Miller, seconded by Ms. Corzo and on voice vote carried unanimously.
