Recognized by the Council President, Mayor La Ronde called for discussion on a new ordinance concerning concealed weapons to be considered at the July 11, 2022 Council Meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT: No one appeared.

COMMENTS BY MAYOR, ADMINISTRATOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS

The Mayor commented on how well Juneteenth celebrations had gone for the first year. One-hundred and fifty (150) red bags were handed out to adults and the vendors were happy. Summer camp began today (June 27th), enrolling one-hundred and fifty (150) kids with forty-five (45) remaining on the waiting list with Covid guidelines observed.

Mayor La Ronde continued with plans to rename the cottage on Vermeule Place "The Apgar House" in memory of Ed and his wife. It will be dedicated to the Food Bank with necessary access work now in progress. On the topic of pop-up parties that have occurred around the state, the Mayor commented that there had almost been one in North Plainfield over the weekend, but adequate notice had been received from the NJ State Police to prevent it.

Finally, the Mayor reminded that the 4th of July Parade would be stepping off on Monday the 4th at 10:00 a.m. as scheduled; and radon kits and bag pods are still available from the Mayor's Office.

Councilman Merrill said that it had been good to have both Messrs. Bernstein and George working in tandem for this meeting. Councilwoman Corzo commended Parks & Recreation and the Mayor for their efforts on Juneteenth while the Council President added a "well-done" to the Mayor for his efforts on the recent memorandum of agreement.
