RESOLUTION NO. 12-12-22-03c LEAP IMPLEMENTATION GRANT

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has appropriated funding for Shared Services and School District Consolidation Study and Implementation Grants to assist local units with the study, development, and implementation of new shared and regional services; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services (DLGS) is tasked with administering these grant funds through the Local Efficiency Achievement Program (LEAP); and

WHEREAS, LEAP Implementation Grants exist to support costs associated with shared services implementation to ensure that meaningful, efficiency generating initiatives are not hindered by short term transitional expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield and the Borough of Watchung propose to enter into a shared services agreement, but face certain expenses associated with implementation that present a burden to the local units; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this shared services agreement is to jointly purchase a fire service ladder truck to further expand the existing automatic mutual aid agreements between our respective fire departments, which will benefit the residents of both participating local units; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield has agreed to be the lead agency in this program and will submit the application to DLGS on behalf of all participating units; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough of North Plainfield, that the Borough of North Plainfield will apply for a LEAP Implementation Grant in the amount up to \$500,000 to support implementation of this shared service.

RESOLUTION NO. 12-12-22-03d Resolution Supporting the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over 2022 Year End Holiday Crackdown

WHEREAS, approximately one-third of all fatal traffic crashes in the United States involve impaired drivers; and

WHEREAS, impaired driving crashes killed 11,654 people in the United States in 2020; and

WHEREAS, impaired driving crashes cost the United States almost \$44 Billion a year; and

WHEREAS, during the past five years New Jersey's roadways experienced 35,307 crashes and 618 fatalities involving impaired drivers; and

WHEREAS, an enforcement crackdown is planned to combat impaired driving; and

WHEREAS, the year-end holiday season is traditionally a time for social gatherings which include alcohol; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey, Division of Highway Traffic Safety, has asked law enforcement agencies throughout the state to participate in the *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over 2022 Year End Holiday Crackdown*; and

WHEREAS, the project will involve increased impaired driving enforcement from December 3, 2022 through January 1, 2023; and

WHEREAS, an increase in impaired driving enforcement and a reduction in impaired driving will save lives on our roadways;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Borough of North Plainfield declares its support for the *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over 2022 Year End Holiday Crackdown* from December 3, 2022 through January 1, 2023 and pledges to increase awareness of the dangers of drinking and driving.

WHEREAS, a number of local governmental units in the State of New Jersey have joined together to form a Joint Insurance Fund as permitted by the Chapter 372 Laws of 1983 (40A:10-36); and

WHEREAS, the statutes and regulations governing the creation and operation of a Joint Insurance Fund contain elaborate restrictions and safeguards concerning the safe and efficient administration of the public interest entrusted to such a Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of North Plainfield, has determined that membership in the Garden State Municipal Joint Insurance Fund (hereinafter referred to as the "Fund") is in the best interests of itself and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of North Plainfield has previously executed a resolution to join the Garden State Municipal Joint Insurance Fund subject to the acceptance of its assessment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Body of the Borough of North Plainfield (hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality") does hereby resolve and agree to renew its membership in the Fund for a period not to exceed three (3) years beginning January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2025 for the purpose of establishing the following types of coverage:

- Motor vehicle liability;
- Property damage (buildings, contents, equipment, and motor vehicle);

- Unmanned Aerial Systems (optional)*
- Hull and P&I (optional)*
- Marina Liability (optional)*

*Optional, subject to underwriting approval and receipt, review, and acceptance of separate completed applications

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield is in need of a assistance in reporting their compliance with the New Jersey Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NJPDES) Municipal Stormwater Regulation Program Tier A Stormwater General Permit requirements for 2023; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield has received a proposal from Grotto Engineering Associates, LLC, dated October 21, 2022, to provide professional services relative to the 2022 Annual NJDEP Stormwater reporting and certification requirements; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield has an obligation to submit an annual report and certification to the New Jersey State Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) pertaining to the Borough's progress on their Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SPPP). This report must be submitted electronically to NJDEP by May 1, 2023 for the 2022 calendar year; and,

WHEREAS, Grotto Engineering Associates, LLC has submitted a proposal, dated October 21, 2022, to assist the Borough with the collection of information and preparation of this report. As part of this task, Grotto Engineering Associates, LLC will review required paperwork and recordkeeping logs. Due to the electronic submission requirement, the Borough will provide Grotto Engineering Associates, LLC with access to the municipal account through a personal identification number. In addition, Grotto Engineering Associates, LLC will work with the Borough to identify any program changes that need to be addressed in the coming year; and,

WHEREAS, the services associated with the 2022 calendar year annual stormwater reporting for 2023 will be charged on an hourly basis, not to exceed Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00); and,

WHEREAS, in addition, the NJDEP requires that all stormwater outfalls operated by the Borough to be inspected periodically in order to ascertain the condition of each outfall and whether or not scouring is a problem at any of the outfalls. The Borough operates eighty-six (86) stormwater outfalls throughout the Borough. Data will be collected electronically as required by NJDEP. The inspections performed will be documented with a report and photos of each outfall where possible; and,

WHEREAS, the services associated with these stormwater outfall inspections on an hourly rate, not to exceed a total amount of Seven Thousand Three Hundred (\$7,300.00) Dollars. Grotto Engineering Associates, LLC will start on the west end of the Borough and perform an inspection of approximately fifteen (15) to twenty (20) outfalls (or as many as possible within the allowable budget maximum of Seven Thousand Three Hundred (\$7,300.00) Dollars).

WHEREAS, the NJDEP MS4 Stormwater Permit requires the Borough to have a system of oversight in place to ensure the adequate long-term operation and maintenance of stormwater facilities approved but not owned or operated by the Borough of North Plainfield. Grotto will review the existing stormwater ordinance and provide the recommended updated language changes required to effectuate the above requirement of the MS4 permit; and,

WHEREAS, the services performed related to stormwater ordinance updates will be billed at an hourly rate, not to exceed a total amount of Two Thousand Four Hundred (\$2,400.00) Dollars for these specific services.
