ORDINANCE NO. 23-03

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, REVISE AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 7A OF THE BOROUGH CODE, ENTITLED "TRAFFIC SCHEDULES", MOST NOTABLY SECTION 7A-21, ENTITLED "SECTION 7A-21 SCHEDULE XXI ON-STREET HANDICAPPED PARKING."

WHEREAS, § 7-15 of the Borough Code of the Borough of North Plainfield provides that certain locations should be designated as handicapped parking spaces reserved for such persons who have been issued special identification cards for plates or placards by the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission or a temporary placard issued by the North Plainfield Borough Chief of Police; and,

WHEREAS, no parking, stopping or standing shall be permitted in such spaces by any vehicle other than a vehicle displaying such a plate or placard; and,

WHEREAS, after proper investigation, the North Plainfield Police Department has determined that 178 Duer Street in the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey does not have any off-street parking, and that a handicapped parking space may therefore be placed there; and,

WHEREAS, after proper investigation, the North Plainfield Police Department has determined that a certain handicapped parking space at Stone Street, in the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey is no longer required and should therefore be removed; and,

WHEREAS, such locations are described in § 7A-21-Schedule XXI of Chapter 7A of the Borough Code; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough finds it necessary and appropriate to amend, revise and supplement Schedule XXI of Chapter 7A-21 of the Borough Code regarding On Street Handicapped Parking, to add a handicapped parking space on Duer Street and remove a handicapped parking space on Stone Street as aforesaid.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the Borough Code of the Borough

ORDINANCE NO. 23-04

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, REVISE AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER 7 OF THE BOROUGH CODE, ENTITLED "TRAFFIC", MOST NOTABLY BY ADDING A NEW § 7-21, ENTITLED "PERMIT PARKING" AND MORE SPECIFICALLY BY AMENDING, SUPPLEMENTING AND REVISNG § 7A, ENTITLED "TRAFFIC SCHEDULES," BY ADDING A NEW § 7A-29, ENTITLED "PERMIT PARKING."

WHEREAS, pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 39:4-197, a municipality may pass, without the approval of the Commissioner of the Motor Vehicle Commission, and consistent with the current standards prescribed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways, ordinances regulating special conditions existent in the municipality on the subjects and within the limitations set forth in Title 39 of the Revised Statutes; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield has a busy downtown commercial district designated the B Business Zone where businesses require deliveries by commercial trucks at properties which have limited or dated curb cuts and access to driveways which are used for access to parking by patrons and also used for deliveries. Such multiple uses of access creates traffic delay and confusion in the commercial areas of the Borough because vehicles are parked in such locations making it difficult for trucks to make deliveries; and,

WHEREAS, such delay and confusion also contributes to reduced pedestrian, student and cycling safety; and,

WHEREAS, the downtown commercial district (B Business Zone) would benefit from a permit parking program which would allow commercial property owners or operators to obtain an on street parking permit to control and limit parking at their site during business hours; and,

WHEREAS, after proper investigation, the North Plainfield Police Department has determined that a permit parking program which would allow downtown commercial property owners or operators in the B Business Zone to obtain on-street parking permits to control patron parking and commercial deliveries at their site during business hours to reduce traffic congestion, ease ingress and egress and provide safer pedestrian and cycling traffic; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of North Plainfield now intends to institute a permit parking program in the B Business Zone for the benefit of its residents and commercial enterprises.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the Borough Code of the Borough of North Plainfield be amended, revised and supplemented as to Chapter 7 of the Borough Code, entitled "Traffic", most notably by adding a new § 7-21, entitled "Permit Parking," and, more specifically, by amending, revising and supplementing § 7A, entitled "Traffic Schedules," to add § 7A-29, entitled "Schedule XXIX, Permit Parking," as follows:

§ 7, Traffic, is hereby amended as follows:

§ 7-21 PERMIT PARKING

§ 7-21.1 On-Street Permit Parking for Commercial Areas.

The Borough Council shall, upon the recommendation of the North Plainfield Police Department, from time to time designate by Ordinance such locations for on-street permit parking for commercial establishments. On-street permit parking may be authorized only for the following purposes:

- A. To alleviate traffic congestion due to limited ingress and egress by patron and commercial traffic to a site;
- B. To provide safe access to sites with limited or no off street parking for commercial deliveries;
- C. To provide safer pedestrian access along the frontage of or into commercial locations;
- D. To provide for reduction in traffic delay or obstruction; and,
- E. Any other reason which is determined by the North Plainfield Police Department to contribute to reduction in traffic delays, obstruction or to contribute to increased pedestrian or cycling use in commercial areas.

§ 7-21.2 Issuance of On-Street Parking Permit

- A. An owner or operator of a commercial establishment which is a permitted use in the Zone wherein the commercial establishment is located shall apply to the North Plainfield Police Department for an on-street permit parking space adjacent to the commercial establishment upon payment of a fifty dollar (\$50.00) application fee and submission of a drawing showing the proposed location of the permit parking space.
- B. Only one (1) on-street permit parking space will be permitted at any single premises, regardless of how many commercial establishments may be located therein or thereon.
- C. The North Plainfield Police Department shall investigate the on-street permit parking request and recommend whether to grant or deny the permit parking space to the Chief of Police for his final decision, subject to § D below.

- D. The Chief of Police or their designee shall notify the mayor and Borough Administrator, who shall then provide for the approval of the on-street permit parking space to be set forth in Borough Code § 7A-29, Schedule XXIX, Permit Parking, or deny the application.
- E. Upon approval of the application for the on-street permit parking space, the owner or operator requesting the permit parking space shall pay a fee of Forty Dollars (\$40.00) per month or any part thereof, or Thirty Five Dollars (\$35.00) per month or any part thereof if purchased for a period of six (6) months or more in any calendar year.
- F. If the on-street permit parking is not renewed before January 31st of each year or at the end of any period of six (6) or more months as set forth in section E, above, the on-street permit parking permit shall be automatically terminated without further action by the Borough or the North Plainfield Police Department.
- G. The owner or operator of the premises making an application for permit parking under § 7-21.2(B) shall, if such application is approved, provide and install signs and pavement markings for the permit parking space which signing and markings shall be in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. The cost of procurement and installation of the signs and pavement markings shall be the responsibility of the owner or operator of said property. The owner shall, subsequent to initial procurement and installation, maintain such signs and pavement markings in good condition at no cost or expense to the Borough. The owner shall be responsible for the repair and restoration or replacement of same.

§ 7A, Traffic Schedules, is hereby amended as follows:

§ 7A-29, SCHEDULE XXIX, PERMIT PARKING

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND BOROUGH CLERK TO ACCEPT A PROPOSAL FROM GROTTO ENGINEERING ASSOCIATES, L.L.C., RELATED TO PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING WORK ON AN HOURLY BASIS FOR MILLING, RESURFACING AND MISCELLANEOUS IMPROVMENTS TO CERTAIN MUNICIPAL PARKING LOTS IN AN AGGREGATE AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THIRTY-SEVEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$37,500.00) AND EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS TO EFFECTUATE SAME.

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield is in need of certain improvements to its municipal parking lots in the Borough, including milling, repaving and miscellaneous repairs to the Community Center driveway, the municipal parking lot off Clinton Avenue, the Police vehicle parking lot behind Borough Hall, the employee and metered parking lot on Somerset Street across from Borough Hall and the metered parking lot on Craig Place (the "Project"), as part of the Borough's improvement of its municipal parking lots; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough of North Plainfield has received a proposal from Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C., dated January 23, 2023 to provide professional services for the Project, including gathering field data for layout and dimensions, bid design documents and bid support, construction observation and contract administration for an hourly fee not to exceed a certain amount; and,

WHEREAS, upon completing the field observations, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will develop mapping, detailed design drawings, technical specifications, and bid documents to provide milling, repaving and miscellaneous repairs for the Project at the identified Borough locations through the field observations. The specifications and construction plans will be compiled in the public bid format and developed using AutoCAD. Design drawings will be presented to the Borough for review and comments prior to bidding. Bid Packages will be sold by Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. from their Cranford office; they will then review all bids and provide recommendation of an award to the Borough; and,

WHEREAS, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. has submitted a proposal in the amount of an hourly fee not to exceed Seventeen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$17,500.00) for the aforementioned bid design documents and an amount as an hourly fee not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$20,000.00) for the aforementioned bid support, contract administration, construction observation services and testing, for an aggregate price not to exceed Thirty Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$37,500.00); and,

WHEREAS, upon an award of contract(s) by the Borough, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will prepare the contract documents and conduct a pre-construction meeting with the contractor, all appropriate Borough personnel and any affected utility companies. During the course of construction, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will provide construction observation and administration services to ensure that the selected contractor is performing all construction in full accordance with the project plans and specifications; and,

WHEREAS, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will review and approve all payment vouchers submitted by the contractor before they are presented for the Borough for payment. Prior to completion, Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. will also provide the contractor with a detailed punch list of the items requiring repair and/or corrections.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of North Plainfield, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that the Borough Council hereby accepts the proposal submitted by Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C. dated January 23, 2023, as to certain improvements to certain municipal parking lots in the Borough for an hourly fee not to exceed the amount of Seventeen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$17,500.00) for the aforementioned bid design documents and for an hourly fee for bid support as per the aforementioned proposal in a total amount not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$20,000.00) for the aforementioned bid support, contract administration, construction observation services and testing, with a total aggregate price for all services not to exceed Thirty Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and No Cents (\$37,500.00); and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Council hereby authorizes the Mayor and the Acting Borough Clerk to sign and/or execute a contract and all other necessary documents to engage the services of Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C., this Project; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the award of this contract shall be subject to the certification of the Borough's Chief Financial Officer as to the availability of funds for payment for same; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the award and the contract and its performance shall be consistent with all applicable laws, the Borough's bid documents (where applicable) and the bid proposal of Grotto Engineering Associates, L.L.C., dated January 23, 2023.

I. MISSION STATEMENT:

My top priority is to build mutual respect, and to provide equal opportunity policing for everyone that lives, works, or passes through the Borough of North Plainfield. By this I mean, Law Enforcement Services that will be fair, honest, and without bias.

The police department's trustworthiness, comes from being a Welcoming and Inclusive Community. It is imperative that our residents and visitors feel safe, respected, and comfortable in being themselves, while also being able to express all aspects of their identities. We are a place where each person shares a mutual sense of belonging with our other members. Inclusion, as well as the appreciation of, and the valuing of human differences, creates an atmosphere that promotes a sense of belonging, so that everyone feels respected and valued for their uniqueness. It is home. A Proud Community.

The North Plainfield Police Department, wants to instill a belief in our community policing philosophy, and establish a confidence that "we as police officers, care more about your well-being than your immigration status, ethnicity, religion or sexual orientation." In many communities across New Jersey, the relationship between members of the community and law enforcement is strained. Our mission as police officers is to protect life, property, and to solve crimes without bias. That goal would be virtually impossible to do effectively, if witnesses or victims had some reluctance to come forward. IV. COMMUNITY OUTREACH:

- A. During 2022, community outreach programs remained in place.
- B. The Youth Police Academy was held in July at the West End School and once again was a great success with 25 cadets graduating. Several recruits returned for a second time. The STEP program was also held over the summer. Both D/Sgt. Domizi and Det. DeJesus participated in the program.
- C. National Night Out was a great success with hundreds of borough residents in attendance. D/Sgt. Domizi coordinates the event and all of the vendors and participants.
- D. The Community Policing Unit oversees the Good Morning Program for the Borough's senior citizens. Every morning any senior citizen in the program receives a telephone call from a police officer to see if they are alright. If the senior citizen does not answer, a welfare check is conducted. The community policing unit also oversees the residential and business false alarms. Follow up investigations are conducted and warnings and summons are issued when appropriate. D/Sgt. Domizi issued 204 first time alarm notifications and 110 General Alarm notifications.
- E. Detective Domizi remains a member of the Municipal Alliance committee and he is also the liaison to the Resource Center of Somerset County which provides assistance to victims of domestic violence. Both D/Sgt. Domizi and Lt. Ciempola attended the North Plainfield Community Forum Meetings. Lt. Ciempola also attended meetings of the Juvenile Justice Commission's "Race, Equity and Inclusion" sub-committee bi-monthly.
- F. Operation Watchdog, which allows all home owners and business owners to register their surveillance systems with the department, remains in place. Residents continue to participate in the program.
- G. The Special Law Enforcement Officer III is in operation, providing specially trained retired police officers for security in our schools. At this time, two SLEO III officers are employed by the Borough and are under the supervision of Det/Sgt Albert Domizi.

V. SOMERSET COUNTY GUNS AND GANG TASK FORCE:

A. In 2022, Officer Justin Pelissier was assigned to the Organized Crime and Narcotics Task Force (OCNTF). He conducted numerous investigations with the Task Force including several in North Plainfield that culminated in arrests in the Borough.

VI. INTERNAL AFFAIRS:

A. During 2022, the police department logged 7 Internal Affairs complaints. Lt. Ciempola investigated 5, Lt. Sinker investigated 1, and Lt. Speck investigated 1. See our website for Major Discipline as per the Attorney Generals Directives.
