Council President Stabile read the following Notice of Compliance:

The Flag Salute was led by Council President Stabile.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Michelle Robertson, 676 Denninger Road, North Plainfield, thanked the Borough for welcoming the North Plainfield Middle School Student Council members into the council chambers to learn the local government process.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. **Library Vestibule Repairs** – L.L. Mr. Hollod briefly detailed the CTS Architects proposal for the repairs to the library vestibule. Unfortunately, the parapet was not built to specs which lead to water infiltration over the years. A full reconstruction of the vestibule area would now be required. Mayor La Ronde added that structural damage from the earthquake was discovered which may require more extensive repair work. Council President Stabile requested the addition of an elevator as well as automatic push door openers.

2. **Discussion of the Master Plan (Planner will be present)** – L.L. Paul Grygiel of Phillips, Preiss, Grygiel, Leheny & Hughes, LLC was present to answer questions. Mr. Grygiel explained that the Master Plan addresses what the community would look like going forward and provides a road map of how to get there. As per State law, the Planning Board prepares and adopts the Master Plan, while the governing body holds the power to implement the recommendations. Indicating that the Master Plan is largely outdated at this point, Mr. Hollod spoke in favor of an update. Mr. Grygiel reminded that COAH obligations would need to be implemented separately. Ms. Corzo noted that a rewrite of the Master Plan would necessitate more consistent Planning Board meetings, specifically for public input. Mr. Grygiel suggested a sub-committee to study the Master Plan over the next year or two.
