#### CID Monthly Report

#### A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On Friday April 8, 2022, at 22:41 hrs., all available units responded to a residence on the east side of town, on the report of a female who was shot by her son's father inside the residence. The caller advised dispatch that he witnessed his father shoot his mother and that he believes his father is still armed with a gun. Upon our arrival, NPPD units approached the residence and took tactical positioning around the residence. The officers observed a group of people in the backyard of a neighbor's residence having a campfire party. The group of people advised officers that nothing was wrong and that nobody heard gunshots or called the police. The officers then entered the residence where the shooting allegedly took place and cleared the residence. Dispatch was unable to contact the caller again and was not able to ping the location of the phone due to the call coming from a Google voice over internet IP cell phone. This led officers to believe that the call was a prank phone call or a SWATTING incident. The Criminal Investigation Division was advised of the incident. The clearing of the residence revealed a possible illegal housing situation. Officers observed five separate and locked bedrooms on the second

floor of the house and one door leading to the attic. A separate report was made for that illegal housing situation.

On April 13, 2022, at 1742 hrs., an officer who was on routine patrol in the area of Route 22 West and Rock Avenue, was notified by the Traffic Safety Sergeant that there was a large group of illegal dirt bikes riding west on Route 22 towards Rock Avenue. The officer parked his vehicle in a gas station on Route 22 West when he observed a large group of approximately 15-20 motorcycles approaching his location. The motorcycles were driving erratically and posing a dangerous threat to both themselves and other motorists by taking up both lanes of the highway, riding on one wheel, blocking and cutting off other vehicles, and then continuing to drive off of the road onto the shoulder and grassy areas. While at his stationary position, multiple motorcycles surrounded his vehicle and 3 of them were 15 feet in front of him on the grass area, revving their engines purposely while facing his direction. One of the motorcyclists who appeared to have a malfunction with his bike, lost control and fell off onto the grass area between the gas station parking lot and the highway. The officer exited his vehicle and verbally ordered him to "Stop". He then took a hold of the rider's arm to try and control his actions. At some point, his arm became entangled and the motorcyclist attempted to flee dragging the officer about 20 feet down the highway. The officer and the motorcyclist fell to the ground and the officer was able to put him in an arm bar, attempting to control him. As he did this, several of the other motorcyclists attacked the officer by kicking him repeatedly in an attempt to free the suspect. At this point, the Traffic Safety Sergeant, an off-duty North Plainfield Detective and a Union County Prosecutor's Office Detective arrived to assist the officer and the other bikers then fled. The suspect was arrested and transported to headquarters. CID responded and the suspect refused to provide any information and would not speak. He was charged with third degree assault on a police officer, third degree resisting arrest, and other charges. He was placed in the County Jail.

On April 24, 2022 at 11:11 hrs., all units responded to a residence on the east side of town on a report of a male with a firearm and a machete in his possession, threatening to kill his family. Patrol units approached the residence and took tactical positioning around the house. A perimeter was established outside the residence and the street in front of the subject house was closed. The occupants were evacuated from the residence with their hands in full view and the interior of house was checked. There was no evidence that a crime was committed. The homeowners and their two sons had just arrived from church. This call was unfounded and determined to be a swatting incident. The dispatcher who took the initial call, related that the telephone number, voice of the male subject, and last name given by the male subject, was possibly the same actor that made a similar type call on April 8, 2022. The Criminal Investigations Division was notified, as were both the Somerset County Prosecutor's Office Major Crimes Unit and the New Jersey State Police Regional Operations and Intelligence Center.
