ADMINISTRATION:

Staffing:

The Police Department is operating below its authorized strength of 48 sworn Officers, and 6 fulltime civilian personnel. Staffing and deficiencies:

- 2 police officers
- 1 Lieutenant's position
- 1 administrative assistant (Records), has been reduced to a 29 hour part-time position.

Injured Officers:

- Officer Brid continued to work on light duty since March 27, 2017, due to surgery he had on November 3, 2016; a result of an on duty accident he had on December 9, 2014. As of February 28, he was out of work for 74 days and on light duty for 217 days.
- Officer Jean-Baptiste was placed on administrative leave March 6, 2017, due to a complaint requiring an investigation. As of February 28, he was out of work for 177 days.

Promotions, New Hires and Retirements:

 Officer Gregory Ternlund was hired and started riding with a Field Training Officer in February.

CID Monthly Report

A Sample of Investigations & Arrests

On February 5, 2018 at approximately 9:30 AM CID was advised that a female resident was at RWJ Hospital New Brunswick reporting that she was the victim of a sexual assault that had occurred on February 2, 2018. A Detective was dispatched immediately and interviewed the victim and a rape examination was conducted by a SANE nurse. A suspect was quickly identified by detectives as the perpetrator. Detectives conducted a consensual overhear between the victim and suspect to solidify the case against him. Detectives also obtained a post Miranda confession from the suspect. It was determined that the victim had been incapacitated with alcohol while the suspect sexually assaulted her. The case was screened and the suspect was formally charged with 1st degree aggravated sexual assault and he was lodged in the county jail on a complaint warrant pending a hearing.

On February 7, 2018 at approximately 11:45 AM, a concerned citizen notified police that they had just seen a suspicious male leaving the residence of 54 Myrtle Ave and he was carrying a yellow bag. Patrol officers converged on the area and located a male suspect matching the description in Greenbrook Park. The male was arrested on a warrant unrelated to the incident and he was subsequently searched incident to the lawful arrest. Police found several copper pipes, extension cords and a hacksaw, which are all consistent with someone stealing scrap. Detectives were sent to 54 Myrtle Ave and it was determined that extensive damage was done to the home and numerous copper pipes had been stolen and damaged. Detectives obtained a taped statement from the witness and the case was screened with the SCPO. The suspect was charged with 3rd degree burglary, DP theft, and DP criminal mischief and DP possession of burglar tools.

On February 19, 2018 at approximately 4:00 PM a patrol officer noticed a pedestrian crossing Greenbrook Road in an unsafe manner. The pedestrian was stopped and advised of the infraction and he was patted down for the safety of the officer. The pedestrian advised the officer that he was carrying a large machete in his pant leg and the weapon was quickly located. The pedestrian was arrested and a detective spoke with him. The pedestrian said that he was in fear of his life from rival gang members and that the weapon was for his protection. He was charged with 4th degree possession of a weapon for an unlawful purpose.

Community Outreach

The Community Policing unit made sixteen (16) calls to the senior citizens enrolled in the Good Morning program, and sent out 45 first time false alarm activation notices. Detective Domizi assisted in numerous Spanish to English translations for investigations, and conducted a tour of HQ's for several Middle School students on February 15, 2018.

Narcotics Strike Force

During February the Narcotics Strike Force conducted various controlled buys in Raritan, New Brunswick, Franklin, South Plainfield, Somerville, Watchung, Edison, Manville and North Plainfield. Undercover buys were completed in Franklin, Somerville and New Brunswick. Various Search Warrants were executed assisting the Ocean County Prosecutors Office. The Strike Force conducted "RIPS" in Watchung, (50 bricks of heroin), South Plainfield (15 Bricks of heroin and \$901.00 of currency), North Plainfield (200g cocaine was seized). Ofc. Dow attended a training class for Passenger Vehicle Interdiction & Concealed Compartments taught by Sgt. Mike Connor of the Maryland State Police.

Other Matters

All detectives attended mandatory agency training on both February 8th & 13th. Det. Segeda attended a special SCPO Dive Team ice training from February 15th through February 19th. Detectives investigated three license applications (1-Limousine owner, 2-Raffle licenses). We have deployed three (3) covert surveillance cameras in strategic locations throughout town. Two cameras are in high crime areas and the third is directed at a burglary suspect who is a person of interest in several recent motor vehicle burglaries. The cameras are recording 24-7 and are reviewed regularly. The cameras have assisted in robbery and theft investigations on several occasions.

Adjudications & Judicial Proceedings

Lt. McKay made an appearance at Grand Jury on February 1, 2018 on two separate matters and an indictment was returned on both cases. One of these cases is a stalking investigation and the other involves approximately \$9000.00 in fraud which was perpetrated upon a local business.

Judge Anthony Picheca sentenced both James Munoz and Rashaun Taylor to ten years each in state prison. The two were jailed for their involvement in the armed robbery of the CVS in 2016. The case was a lengthy investigation by CID which involved the execution of a search warrant and the seizure of the weapons used in the armed robbery.
